Special Hearing: Giant Eagle Get-Go Liquor License Transfer – A representative from Giant Eagle, Inc. was present to request Council approval of a liquor license transfer request for the new store being constructed at 1250 Chartiers Ave and provided a detailed explanation of how Giant Eagle plans to utilize the license explaining hours of sale, what kind of alcohol will be sold, limits of alcohol sales and consumption, et al.

Public Comment:

Ms. Maribeth Taylor, resident, was present to provide information that the complaints the Borough listed as concerns in the ALCOSAN suit such as noise and pollution are the exact same concerns the residents have with the Giant Eagle Get-Go project. Ms. Taylor feels that allowing a liquor license at this location is offensive and is asking Council to deny the liquor license transfer as it's the only way to protect the residents in the 3rd Ward.

Ms. Samantha Levitzski-Wright, resident, was present to also request Council's denial of liquor license transfer for safety reasons in the community. Ms. Levitski-Wright briefly mentioned recent shootings in the community and having to put up a privacy fence on property as precautionary measures. Ms. Levitski-Wright feels if the store can not offer groceries which is what the community needs, it should'nt be allowed to offer alcohol sales.

Mr. David Flick, resident commented briefly that he is in agreement with the previous speaker that we really don't need another place to have alcohol sales that we need groceries.

A motion was made by Councilman Mixter and seconded by Vice-President Walker to approve the Liqour License Transfer by Resolution. Roll Call requested, resulting in 6 Yes, 1 No (Delgado). Motion carries.

Agenda Comments/Changes:

President Brinza reminded all in attendance that all communications must remain respectful and professional as the public meetings are being recorded.

Police Excellence Awards presented by Chief of Police Richard Deliman to Officer Kluchurosky and Officer Kelly for providing life saving measures during two recent police calls involving community shooting(s).

Guest Speaker: Mr. Mark Turic and Mr. Day Bracy was present to ask for Council approval to hold a traveling "Beers of the Burgh" beer market/arts & music festival on August 27, 2021 in McKees Rocks on two lots along Chartiers Avenue, owned by the McKees Rocks CDC. Mr. Bracy indicated that they are inviting any local businesses to participate as well, and has already made contact with Black Forge Coffee as one vendor. Mr. Turic responded to Council's questions that they would work with the Borough for all necessary permits and with the police department for any security if Council suggests.

A motion was made by Councilman Radoycis and seconded by Councilman Myers to approve the event request by Mr. Turic and Mr. Bracy. Motion was adopted by acclamation.

Mr. Richard Ashby, Jr, Sto-Rox Public Library Director was present to give Council updates regarding a community event scheduled for August 28, 2021 9am-5pm which will have art work on display, children's books, story hours, promoting children literacy.

A motion was made by Councilman Radoycis and seconded by Councilwoman Delgado to approve the community event. Motion was adopted by acclamation.

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made by Councilman Mixter and seconded by Councilman Myers to approve the meeting minutes from June 15, 2021 public meeting. Motion was adopted by acclamation.

- McKees Rocks Police Department—Chief Deliman read the monthly activity report for June 2021. A copy of the report is on file at the Borough Manager office.
- McKees Rocks Independent Volunteer Fire Department VFD President Jim Tarbert read the monthly activity report for June 2021. A copy of the report is on file at the Borough Manager office.
- Mayors Report: Mayor Muhr briefly updated Council regarding the abandon car issue within the community, as well as sending violation notices to property owners for garbage issues and grass/weed overgrowth. Mayor Muhr also commented about speaking with Port Authority recently about the bus shelter contract.
- Borough Manager: Substitute Borough Manager Wozniak reported the 2nd round of Creditech delinquent sewage is scheduled for next week, Standard & Poors has contacted the Borough for a phone

conference interview to update the Borough's 2021 credit rating, and the 2021 Worker's Comp Safety in Workplace application is due for renewal, which saves the Borough 5% on the insurance premium.

- Borough Solicitor: Borough Solicitor Turnbull provided Council with multiple updates regarding an updated Sunshine Law that goes into effect August 30th, the Conservatorship of 606 Chartiers Avenue is required to have liability insurance, RTK Law Request fees collected is set by the law itself and only requests for sensitive information should be reviewed by the Solicitor, status of 300 Catherine Street request for commercial zoning, and lastly drafting an Ordinance amendment for paving of parking lots.
- Building Code Official: Substitute Borough Manager Wozniak read the monthly activity report for June 2021 written by Mr. John Stahl, and a copy is on file at the Borough Manager's office.
- Code Enforcement Officer: Mr. Zac Cummings, Code Enforcement Officer read the monthly Code Enforcement activity report for June 2021, and a copy is on file at the Borough Manager's office.
- Borough Engineer: Capsule Report was discussed at Caucus Meeting on July 12, 2021.

Controllers Report: As of June 30, 2021, General Fund, both income and expenses have an annual budget of \$4,503,377.00. Income was \$2,479,004.97 or 55.05% of the budgeted income. Expenses totaled \$1,797,980.15 or approximately 39.93 % of the budgeted expenses.

Balance in the General Fund Checking Account as of June 30, 2021 was \$303,994.56.

As of June 30, 2021, Sewer Fund, both income and expenses have an annual budget of \$1,976,085.00. Income was \$1,087,288.36 or 55.02% of the budgeted income. Expenses totaled \$825,909.14 or 41.8 % of the budgeted expenses. Balance remaining in the Sewer Fund as of June 30, 2021 was \$363,963.23.
